RHODES SCHOLARSHIP (www.rhodesscholar.org)

For study toward a master's or second bachelor's degree at the University of Oxford. Scholarship covers all education/living expenses for two years.

- Be between eighteen and twenty-three years of age on 10/1 of your application year
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent residence, Have a competitive G.P.A.
- Have a demonstrated record of academic achievement, leadership, and concern for others.
- 32 awards

MARSHALL SCHOLARSHIP (www.marshallscholarship.org) For full-time graduate study in any British colleges for two years. All education/living expenses are paid.

- Be a U.S. citizen, Have a minimum G.P.A. of 3.7
- Earned first undergraduate degree within the last 2.5 years
- Presented an academic plan and demonstrated potential to make a significant contribution to society
- 40 awards

GEORGE J. MITCHELL SCHOLARSHIP (www.us-irelandalliance.org) For one year of study or research at one of 11 institutions in Ireland or Northern Ireland. All education/living expenses are paid.

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Have a demonstrated record of intellectual distinction, leadership activity and extra-curricular activity
- Demonstrated honesty, integrity, fairness and unselfish service to others, indicating a potential for future leadership and contribution to society
