

NATIONAL & INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS AND FELLOWSHIPS

The National & International Scholarships & Fellowships (NISF), a program under the CAELD, provides UNM students opportunities to apply nationally competitive scholarships. We encourage you to investigate potential opportunities as early as possible so that you can start building a compelling application and curriculum vita.

Most of these scholarships require UNM institutional nomination. Students must submit the UNM preliminary application (nisf.unm.edu) to gain the institutional endorsement.

RHODES SCHOLARSHIP (www.rhodesscholar.org)

For study toward a master's or second bachelor's degree at the University of Oxford. Scholarship covers all education/living expenses for two years.

<UNM deadline - Early March; Rhodes deadline - early October>

- Be between eighteen and twenty-three years of age on 10/1 of your application year
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent residence, Have a competitive G.P.A.
- Have a demonstrated record of academic achievement, leadership, and concern for others.
- 32 awards

MARSHALL SCHOLARSHIP (www.marshallscholarship.org)

For full-time graduate study in any British colleges for two years. All education/living expenses are paid. <UNM deadline - Early March; Marshall Deadline - early October>

- Be a U.S. citizen, Have a minimum G.P.A. of 3.7
- Earned first undergraduate degree within the last 2.5 years
- Presented an academic plan and demonstrated potential to make a significant contribution to society
- 40 awards

GEORGE J. MITCHELL SCHOLARSHIP (www.us-irelandalliance.org)

For one year of study or research at one of 11 institutions in Ireland or Northern Ireland. All education/living expenses are paid. <UNM deadline - Early March; Mitchell Deadline - early October>

- be a U.S. citizen
- have a demonstrated record of intellectual distinction, leadership activity and extra-curricular activity
- Demonstrated honesty, integrity, fairness and unselfish service to others, indicating a potential for future leadership and contribution to society
- 12 awards

GATES CAMBRIDGE SCHOLARSHIP (www.gatescambridge.org)

An international scholarship program to enable outstanding graduate students from outside the United Kingdom to study at the University of Cambridge <Gates Cambridge deadline - Mid October>

For students with intellectual ability, leadership capacity and desire to use their knowledge to contribute to society throughout the world by providing service to their communities and applying their talents and knowledge to improve the lives of others

- Be citizens of any country outside the United Kingdom.
- Must apply to pursue one of the full-time residential courses of study.

FULBRIGHT SCHOLARSHIP (US.fulbrightonline.org)

For U.S. graduating college seniors, graduate students, young professionals and artists to study, conduct research or be an English teaching assistant abroad for one academic year. <UNM deadline – Early September; Fulbright deadline - mid October>

- Be U.S. citizens at the time of application.
- Have a conferred bachelor's degree before the start of the grant.
- Be in good health. Grantees will be required to submit a satisfactory Medical Certificate from a physician.
- Have sufficient proficiency in the written and spoken language of the host country sufficient to communicate with the people and to carry out the proposed study/research. This is especially important for projects in the social sciences and the humanities.

HARRY S. TRUMAN SCHOLARSHIP (www.truman.gov)

For students who plan to pursue a career in public service. Awards up to \$30,000 for graduate study. <UNM deadline - End of September; Truman deadline - early March>

- Be an undergraduate junior or a senior in the 3rd year
- Be a U.S. citizen
- Have a highly competitive G.P.A.
- Plan to work in Public Service (government, education, a nonprofit org, etc.)
- Plan to pursue a graduate degree in law, public administration, public health, social work, education, public policy, international affairs, etc.
- 55 - 60 awards

BARRY M. GOLDWATER SCHOLARSHIP (goldwater.scholarsapply.org)

For undergraduate study leading to careers in STEM areas. Awards up to \$7,500 for junior and/or senior year(s). <UNM deadline - End of October; Goldwater deadline - end of January>

- Be a sophomore or junior at the time of application
- Be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident
- Have a highly competitive GPA
- Major in math, natural science, or engineering
- Have research experience in the fields
- Plan to pursue Ph.D. in STEM

MORRIS & STEWART UDALL SCHOLARSHIP (www.udall.gov)

For undergraduates who intend to pursue careers related to (1) the environment, (2) tribal public policy, or (3) Native health care. Awards up to \$5,000 for junior and/or senior year. You have to be a Native American to apply for (2) and (3). <UNM deadline - Mid-November; Udall deadline – early March>

- Be a sophomore or junior at the time of application
- Have a college GPA of at least “B”/3.0
- Be a U.S. citizen or permanent residence
